The Epiphany of the Lord

Each church year, the feast of the Epiphany falls on the Sunday after the celebration of the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Epiphany Sunday celebrates the manifestation of God's salvation to all people through the birth of Jesus.

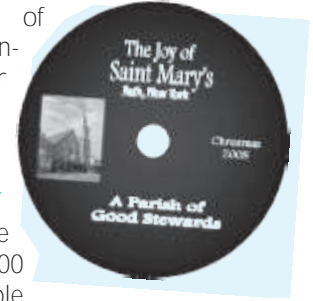
God's full revelation of universal salvation, of course, comes to fruition in the birth of Jesus. Just as prophesied by Isaiah, we hear in the Gospel reading from Matthew that the wealth of nations was brought to the infant Jesus. The Magi from the East came to do homage to Jesus, bringing with them their treasures, the "gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

In his Letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul tells the Christian community at Ephesus of his "stewardship" that was given to him for their "benefit." Paul saw himself as the steward of the good news that through Jesus, God's grace was now offered to both Jews and Gentiles. Much of St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians emphasizes the need for unity between Jews and Gentiles in the body of Christ.

Epiphany Sunday celebrates the manifestation of God's plan to save all people through his Son. Like Paul, we have been called to be stewards of this good news. Whenever we reach out to build unity among ourselves and our various communities of faith, others can see the glory of the Lord shining. By doing so, we give homage to the newborn Jesus.

Stewardship Commitment Weekend

On this Feast of Epiphany, we invite you to pick up your Free copy of the new DVD produced by our Stewardship Committee entitled *The Joy of Saint Mary's*. The DVD includes nearly 300 photos of the people and ministries that make St. Mary's such a wonderful place to worship, to grow in faith, and to serve God and our community. The DVD also includes an original song *Christmas at Saint Mary's* written and performed by our own singer/songwriter Brad Ordway and *All Saints Together* a song that Deacon Ray wrote and sang on the Feast of All Saints.



A copy of this DVD is reserved for you in thanksgiving for your Stewardship of Time, Talent and Treasure. A certificate redeemable for the DVD was included with a letter mailed to you this week by Deacon Ray and our Stewardship Committee.

Our parish depends on all of us to return a portion of the gifts of time, talent and treasure that God has bestowed on us. The form was designed to help you discern in what ways you will use these gifts at the parish level over the next six months. Your commitment to financially support your parish over the next six months will help us operate in the black during this period of pastoral transition.

In May 2009, you will again be asked to renew and if necessary adjust (up or down) your financial commitment to St. Mary's for the fiscal year 2009/2010. With your cooperation, our Finance Committee will then be able to develop a responsible budget to present to our next pastoral leader.

When Jim and I, along with Amy, moved to Bath in 1976, we were glad to be a part of St. Mary's Parish, since

both of our families had a devotion to the Blessed Mother. Within a month of our moving, Lyman Sheils had recruited Jim to be a part of a bingo team with Bob Sestak, Bob Roote and Ferd Stenta.

Along with Dawn Reagan, I joined the Rosary Society where we were the youngest members. When I was 6 months pregnant with Jeannie, I had an appendectomy. Bernie Spanneut heard of my plight and the Prayer Group, including Mary Giblin and Fran Abbey and many others, prayed for my recovery and the safe delivery of Jeannie. Martha Stenta brought over a meal for us. She told me not to reciprocate but rather to "Pass it on".

During the latter part of the '70s and much of the '80s, our spiritual life in the parish revolved around sacramental preparations for baptisms, first penances, first Eucharist, and confirmations. Our social life became very intertwined with St. Mary's parish activities. By the time Cathy started school, she already knew Sister Mary Agnes, Sister Barbara, Carol von Hagn, and Kathy (Francis) McDonald, etc.

After the close of the school, and a beautiful ending Mass by Father Bonin and Father O'Malley, Father Hammond asked us to participate on the Family Mass committee. Family Mass was a multi-generational small Christian community which included Mass, supper and a seasonal liturgical activity.

In 1986, I was hospitalized and once again St. Mary's parishioners prayed for my recovery. When Tim was born in 1988, parishioners prayed for a safe delivery.

During this time, our girls participated in the Youth Group and were altar servers.

(Later on, Tim and Jim became an altar serving team for the Lake Country Disciples.) We helped the Youth Group out with fundraising and other activities. I was



very privileged to be sent by St. Mary's as a chaperone to the NCYC in Kansas City which was a fantastic spiritual experience.

When Jim's dad died unexpectedly in 1992, we had the support of many parishioners in our grief. During the time that Jim's mother battled oral cancer from 1997 through 2004, we were sometimes MIA from St. Mary's, depending on time schedules for medications, etc. That is how we came to be "unofficial ambassadors" for the Central Steuben Cluster Parishes, attending Mass in the neighboring parishes. Once again we were grateful for the prayer support of our St. Mary's family, helping us through difficult times.

In 2003, Cathy and Gary were married at St. Mary's with Father Schatzel and Deacon Ray attending. What a glorious day!

Since then, Jim has served two terms on the Parish Council and I am a Monday money counter on Barb Perry's team (when I don't forget it is my week!). I continue to fill in when needed with Youth Group activities, baking, helping out at fairs, rummage sales, etc.

The community of St. Mary's has been an integral part of our family's spiritual, emotional, personal, and social life. We support St. Mary's by use of our time, talent, and treasure because St. Mary's has nurtured our children, provided opportunities for spiritual growth and maturity and comforted our family in its need.

Notes from Deacon Ray Defendorf

The 4% Stewardship Challenge

Within the last few days, all registered St. Mary's parishioners should have received our Stewardship Commitment Letter. In it, we ask that you consider making a pledge of financial support to your parish for the next six months. Stewardship is a response, made in faith and gratitude, to the God who is the Source of everything we have and enjoy. In the scriptures, God asks that we return to him a tithe, which is literally 10%, of our earnings. And the response of one who realizes God's gifts in his or her life is one of awe: "What return can I make to the Lord for all his kindness to me?" (Ps. 116:12).

In biblical times, these tithes were used to support the priests, and "the widows and orphans", i.e., those who had no other means of support. Today the church uses your gifts to do much the same. Your offerings pay the salaries of those who minister to you and your family, provides for the maintenance and upkeep of your parish buildings and equipment, subsidizes the religious education of our children and continuing faith formation of the adult members of our community, and are used to aid those in need. We are a tithing parish, giving an amount equal to 4% of our offertory collection to Catholic Charities Turning Point before we even worry about our own needs.

Stewardship – the gift of our time, talent and treasure – lies at the heart of what it means to be a Christian. We receive God's gifts, cultivate them responsibly, share them generously in loving justice with others, and attempt to make some return to the Lord out of deep gratitude for the many blessings we have received. **Stewardship isn't something we "do"; it is the way we are to live.**

It is our sincere hope that you will entertain this Stewardship Commitment request seriously and respond for at least the next six months with a sacrificial gift commitment of at least 4% of your net income.

What would that look like? If your take home pay is \$300 a week, it would mean that \$9 would go immediately into your weekly offertory envelope as your "first fruits". If your weekly take home pay is \$1000, your 4% tithe to the parish would be \$40. God asks for our first fruits – and be honest: if you are only giving from what's leftover in your pockets Sunday morning, many days it would only be lint!

We are a tithing parish, giving an amount equal to 4% of our Offertory collection to Catholic Charities Turning Point before we even worry about our own needs.

Yes, sacrificial giving is a sacrifice, and sacrifices hurt. But we need to trust that God will reward us for our faithfulness. If 4% right now is too great a stretch for you, consider volunteering 4% of more of your time each week to a parish or community ministry or perhaps your first hour's wages as a Stewardship gift to the church each week?

Remember that we are asking you to make this initial Stewardship Commitment for only the next six months. In late May or early June, you will be invited to reassess your giving level as our parish Finance Committee establishes a realistic budget to present to our next pastoral leader.
